APA STYLE

*Note: Proper format is listed first, followed by an example.
There are different referencing styles as well—check with your teacher for their preference.
There are small differences between PRINT and ON-LINE versions of the same type of source.*

Please note that Google is a search engine and NOT a reference!

BOOKS

Author last name, First initial. (Year of publication). *Title capitalizing only the first word and the first word of the subtitle (and any Proper Names)*. Publisher's location without the state, province or country: Publisher's name.

Example: One Author

Cheetham, N. (2006). *Universe: A journey from Earth to the edge of the cosmos*. London: Quercus.

Example: Multiple Authors and/or Second Edition

Rothby, C., et al. (1999). *Caring for thoroughbred horses*. (2nd ed.). Toronto: McGraw Hill Ryerson.

ENCYCLOPEDIA- Print & On-line

Entry searched. (Year of publication). In *Name of Encyclopedia*. (Volume #, page #). Publisher location: Publisher.

Example (Print):

Parrakeet. (1999). In *International wildlife encyclopedia*. (Vol. 6, p.271). New York: Marshall Cavendish corp.

Example (On-line)*:

Lacrosse. (2010). In *Canadian encyclopedia online*. Retrieved from www.thecanadianencyclopedia.com/index.cfm?PgNM=TCESearch&Params=A1>

*Volume and page numbers are not needed.

NEWSPAPER (On-line)

Author Last name, First initial. (Year, Month and day of publication). Title capitalizing only the first word and the first word of the subtitle (and any Proper Names). *Newspaper Name*. Retrieved from URL

Example (Electronic):

Avery, B. (2000, February 9). Oil prices likely to remain high: Non-OPEC suppliers unable to challenge cartel. *The Edmonton Journal*. Retrieved from www.edmontonjournal.com

MAGAZINE (On-line)

Author last name, First initial. (Year, Month of publication). Title capitalizing only the first word and the first word of the subtitle (and any Proper Names). *Magazine Name*, Page numbers. Retrieved from URL

Example (On-line database):

Lanken, D. (1996, March-April). When the earth moves. *Canadian Geographic*, 66-73. Retrieved from Canadian Reference Centre EBSCOhost database www.search.epnet.com

Example (Website)*:

Abilock, D. (1997, November-December). The gestalt of online searching. *Multimedia Schools*. Retrieved from www.infotoday.com/MMSchools/nov97/story/htm

* = Notice you do NOT include pages numbers when it is from a website.

ACADEMIC JOURNALS (On-line)

Author last name, First initial. (Year of publication). Title capitalizing only the first word and the first word of the subtitle (and any Proper Names). *Journal Name*, volume#, Page numbers. Retrieved from URL

Example:

Tolson, N. (2008). Making books available: The role of early libraries, librarians, and booksellers in the promotion of African American children's literature. *African American Review*, 32, 9-12. Retrieved from www.jstor.org/search

INTERNET

Author last name, First initial (if known)/Name of sponsoring organization. (Year). *Title of site or page*. Retrieved from URL

Example: Entire Site- with author known and unknown

Schrock. K. (2001). *Kathy Schrock's guide for educators*. Retrieved from www.discoveryschools/schrock.com/

Lonely Planet. (2011). *Iceland*. Retrieved from www.lonelyplanet.com/iceland

Example: Diagram or Map

Example: Photographs
